Interviews for Regional Prevention Coordinator

We are participating in a regional effort with Newburyport, Georgetown, and Triton which will provide our community with access to and support from a Regional Prevention Coordinator. This individual will work with each community to conduct a needs assessment and to develop community efforts to create/enhance supports and services that promote resiliency and positive decision making for our youth. The foundation of this work is grounded in the *40 Developmental Assets* created by the Search Institute. These assets are considered the "building blocks of healthy development that help young children grow up healthy, caring and responsible." The assets are divided into two main categories and then further broken down into subcategories. The external category consists of support, empowerment, boundaries and expectations, and constructive use of time. The internal assets are commitment to learning, positive values, social competencies and positive identify. There is research that suggests that individuals that have a greater number of the 'assets' have a greater likelihood to make better choices around engaging in risky behaviors, such as drug and alcohol use. I was impressed with the range of skills that the candidates each would bring to the position, and I am very encouraged by the candidate pool. I will continue to keep everyone informed as we move forward with this effort.

School Committee Building and Ground Subcommittee

Monday evening, the school committee building and grounds subcommittee met. There were two topics on the agenda: Amesbury Innovation High School and Landry Stadium. The district has issued a request for proposals to secure space for the Amesbury Innovation High School for the upcoming year. Details about the RFP can be found at: <http://schools.amesburyma.gov/news.cfm?story=128336&school=383> The subcommittee also discussed the current use and upkeep of Landry Stadium. Currently, Landry is owned by the city and managed by the Landry Stadium Committee. During this meeting, we reviewed financial documents for the Enterprise Fund set up for Landry Stadium in order to get a better sense of the revenue sources and types of expenditures that are incurred annually for the stadium.

AIHS – "The Amazingly Innovative Race"

On Tuesday, I had the opportunity to be part of the Innovation High School's final large-scale project of the year. The project was the brainstorm of teachers Pat Hamilton and Dan Swanson and was designed to accommodate the student's desire to learn in creative ways, to teach real world critical thinking/problem solving skills and to support the school's SEL curriculum. Students worked in teams, along with a teacher advisor, to complete a variety of challenges that took them throughout





the community and promoted engagement with a variety of school and community leaders. It was an exciting event that truly energized the students and offered them multiple opportunities to develop real-life skills. I was glad to have had the opportunity to be a part of it.

City Council Meeting

Tuesday evening, the city council held the public hearing and voted on the budget for fiscal year 2018. The council voted a school budget of \$30,589,294. In addition, the council was also presented with some capital improvement requests from the school department. The council members voted unanimously to approve \$128,000 for the purchase of technology. These funds will be used to purchase computers (ie. Chromebook carts) for the district. In addition, there was a request for \$250,000 to support a variety of capital requests from the schools. There was discussion from the councilors about the funding source for this request. Some councilors questioned the funding source for this request, feeling that it had specific identified uses and that the types of requests proposed did not fit within that criteria. As a result, this funding did not pass the 2/3 required vote, with Councilors Sherwood, Staganelli, Lavoie and Scorzoni voting against the request. The school district had identified the following uses for the following areas:

Chief Ouellet has always been an incredible resource to the schools. At Tuesday night's city council meeting, the Mayor announced the appointment of current acting chief William Scholtz as the new Chief, effective July 1st. Acting Chief Scholtz will do a great job continuing the work of Chief Ouellet throughout the community, but particularly in supporting our schools. We have been having ongoing meetings regarding school safety and strategies to enhance our safety protocols. Congratulations to Chief Scholtz!

Training for Administrators


Wednesday, school leadership participated in a training about bullying in the workplace and incivility presented by Dr. John Fuller. Dr Fuller's professional background spans over 22 years in Diversity education, EEO, disability awareness, bullying behavior, and disability etiquette through the military, corporate, federal, and nonprofit arenas. The key areas of focus for this training were to:

- Examine external factors, implicit association, and personalities contributing to incivil behaviors
- Assess supervisor/employee relationship
- Describe significant impacts of cascading incivility
- Define bullying and bullying behaviors
- Examine individual and leadership reactions to and accountability for bullying and incivility behaviors






