This event is held in recognition of a worldwide campaign for human rights that engages men to help end

During our breakfast, we had the opportunity to hear from a variety of people, including Massachusetts Attorney General Maura Healey. The highlight for me was when two Amesbury High School Students, Tristan Sullivan-Parks and Mya Kermelewicz, shared their very personal stories about why the decided to get involved with the MVP (Mentors in Violence Prevention) program. Both Tristan and Mya were open, honest and incredibly brave to stand in front of a room filled with people explaining their past experiences with violence. I give both Mya and Tristan so much credit for being so courageous.

Joint Education Council Meeting

Wednesday evening, Joan Liporto and I met with a group of city councilors and school committee members who represent their respective bodies on the joint education council. This particular evening, we focused on the budget. We shared our story about where the budget process started and how we arrived at the proposed superintendent's budget.
