District-Wide Curriculum Work

Our teachers have been engaged in a curriculum development project where we are re-examining our curriculum to ensure rigor and high expectations, while at the same time embedding social emotional learning across the content areas. This week, English and math teachers each spent a day discussing curriculum. This is a major undertaking for the district, as it has been a number of years since the curriculum has been examined district-wide and where teachers from grades pre-kindergarten through grade twelve are meeting together to discuss expectations for our students across the continuum. It is a great exercise for setting learning standards when one identifies our expectations for our students as they graduate, and then back up that skill all the way to identifying what it looks like in a kindergarten classroom. This work will ensure that there is consistency in curriculum and expectations both within a grade-level (across schools at the elementary level) and across grade-levels.
