Present at 7:00 p.m. were Mayor Gray; Chair; Bonnie Schultz, Peter Hoyt, Christian Scorzoni Rob Chamberlain, Katie Veseley, SAC Representative and Dr. Gary Reese, Interim Superintendent of Schools.

Absent were Deb LaValley and Tom McGee

Mayor Gray called the meeting to order at 7:02 and Peter Hoyt led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance and read the Mission Statement aloud.

III. PRESENTATIONS AND REPORTS BY THE SUPERINTENDENT AND STAFF

A. Middle School Presentation - Michael Curry, Principal

Mr. Curry began by acknowledging last nights' wonderful AEFI Evening of Giving. Amesbury Middle School was awarded 2 grants totally \$15,000. (Kathryn Hill and Mary Mitchell)

Mr. Curry presented the committee with a Power Point on happenings at the middle school:

INMAX (Independent Schools of Maximum Complexity) Consortium

- Partnership with TLA (Teaching and Learning Alliance) at AMS
- Lab classrooms 16 teachers involved teachers try-out innovative strategies with specific training more collaboration learning culture within the building.
- Expands learning environment
- Lab classrooms effect on school culture and climate mini lessons with guided instructions working together students engagement with teacher
- More student choices Anchor Charts Making Thinking Visible + Student voice + Sharing Word
- Essential Learning's Meaningful Student Engagement; Teacher Collaboration; Purposeful Lesson/Unit Design; Reflective Practice; Thinking is Visible; Modeling; Gradual Release of Responsibility

Questions from the committee:

Mrs. Schultz was wondering when the staff has time to get together and work on this program? *Mr. Curry stated during Early Release Days*, *PD and PRT Days*. Mr. Hoyt asked if Mr. Curry has data to reflect the progress of students in this

new program? Mr. Curry stated that the program is not perfected yet, but has received positive feedback from students and staff.

Positive Behavior Based Incentive Program - Initiated by John Lyman, Teacher

- New this year changing climate of the school
- Received a grant from Cumberland Farms for \$1500. to defray costs of incentives.
- New fifth graders were applauded when entering the kickoff assembly. Eighth graders will also be applauded at the final assembly of the year.
- Students receiving good deed tickets 20 students have already receive prizes for good deed done
- John Lyman and Steve O'Connor working together on the C.A.R.E. (Character; Attitude and Accountability; Respect and Responsibility; Empathy) Program. End of year big prizes

Grade 8 Trip

- Disney Trip 14th year great program. 70 80% of class attends no child has been denied for lack of funds. Student to chaperone ration 4:1. Cost this year \$900.
- Programs that are covered at Disney include Science; Theatre; Showcase; Behind the scene learning and many other learning experiences through the Disney *YES Program*.
- Real Life Benefits Ambassadors of Amesbury; First time leaving Amesbury, in an airport, on a plane, staying at a hotel; Make decisions and work as a group; Depend on each other; Support and watch out for each other; Make connections and friendships with peers that normally don't occur at school.

B. MCAS Preliminary Data – Lyn Jacques

Mrs. Jacques spoke about the following:

- Report is different than in the past years state is still analyzing PARCC data
- Walked through and showed an example of the Parent/Guardian Report that went home last Wednesday
- Coalition between MCAS Data and MAP Data
- Grades 3-10 take ELA and Math and grades 5, 8, and 10 take science, technology and engineering.
- Looked at district verses state results noted that grade 5 and 6 are below state and working on the transitions between those grades to fill in the gap.
- What do we know? Amesbury on a trajectory of growth; Math in 5th and 6th grade area of concern; high needs population continues to grow; Will not know which test the state will decide to use until November.

Mrs. Schultz noted the big gap between the scores in 5th grade. Mrs. Jacques stated that that is an area of concern with a lot of factor, 5th grade needs to be looked at. She did point out, looking at the chart the 7th, 8th and 10th grades correct themselves.

C. Report of the Assistant Superintendent

Deirdre Farrell spoke about the following:

- Tonight's finance meeting cancelled and rescheduled for November 2nd at 5:30
- AHS, MPFT, Walter Brooks will be retiring on November 30th after 28 years

of service.

- Interviewed 7 applicants out of 28 for Patrice Pierce's job. Will be calling back 2 today for a second interview. The interview team is: Joy Berube, Dr. Reese, Ms. Farrell. Patrice Pierce will be joining the team for the second interviews. Both candidates have technology and HR components Looking to appoint someone soon.
- Transportation/bus passes collecting fees Bus drivers are checking green passes for ridership. Working closely with Salter Transportation
- Green Communities Grant at AMS moving forward proposals out there safety of the students is our main concern.

D. Report of the Superintendent

Dr. Reese spoke about the following:

• Educator Goals – Dr. Reese went over his 3 Goals as part of the educator evaluation process (Student Learning Goal; Professional Practice Goal and District Improvement Goal, communication) – He asked for feedback from the committee.

Mr. Chamberlain liked the goals but felt there was a lack of outcome in the first goal. Mr. Hoyt expressed his appreciation for the time Dr. Reese put into these clear goals.

Motion by Mr. Hoyt, seconded by Mrs. Schultz to appropriate Dr. Reese's Annual Goals as discussed. Vote: Yes, Unanimous.

- City Council Meeting held October 13th
 - Municipal Council 2015-048 voted in favor of the establishment of a Special Education Stabilization Fund
 - Municipal Council 2015-066 acceptance of \$106,000. in capital funding for technology in the APS
 - Establishment of an Ad Hoc Committee on Schools increase communication with City Council and School Committee – councilors Sherwood, McClure and Bezanson will be on the City side of this committee.
- Update on Bill S.2020 An Act Relative to Substance abuse Prevention Dr. Reese spoke with Senator Kathleen O'Connor-Ives hoping to get more information and the expectations of the schools moving forward with this Bill. Senator O'Connor-Ives did not have a lot of answers at this time. This Bill will be going to the House for review. Dr. Reese will be updating the committee when the information is clear.

Motion by Mr. Hoyt, seconded by Mr. Chamberlain to appoint Deb LaValley, Bonnie Schultz and Tom McGee to serve as the School Committee Subcommittee on the Ad Hoc Committee. Vote: Yes, Unanimous.

Mr. Chamberlain ask Dr. Reese if there was a discussion with drawing down the revolving fund (Special Education Stabilization Fund). *No there was not*.
